LEHP Committee Report

Since it was decided to start the adult vision screening program under the umbrella of LEHP, the district purchased the first Humphrey Visual Field Instrument at a cost of \$4,740.00. Seventeen clubs have donated so far for a total of \$5,555.00. Current balance in the LEHP account is \$815.00 according to my records, subject to district secretary verification. Detail is attached. In January I had Tami Radwill from Wisconsin Prevent Blindness conduct our first training session in the district. It was held in Mt Horeb and was attended by 35 individuals with 13 clubs represented. From February through July I have given four presentations at regular club meetings at Monroe, Columbus, Mazo and Cross Plains. We conducted five actual screenings. They were at Fitchburg, Columbus, Cross Plains, Mt. Horeb and two locations in Madison. We screened 222 people with an 85% referral rate. Tami Radwill conducted a second training session at Lancaster in June with 12 people attending from several clubs from the southwest corner of the district. Lancaster has their first screening scheduled in the March time frame next year. Tami had a third training session July 27th at Stoughton Lioness. Columbus has their second

screening scheduled for October this year. They conducted their first screening this past May. I have one more demo on the calendar for Evansville in October and one tentatively planned for Beloit. I have our 6th screening scheduled for Saturday August 20 at the Hy Vee store in Madison with the Madison East Club. I have had one more request for information and a demo from the Juneau Lions, the second from outside our district.
