• LEBW is preparing to participate in a National Clinical Trials research study to examine the impact of diabetes and its severity in donors and recipients who receive a type of transplant surgery known as Descemet Membrane Endothelial Keratoplasty (DMEK). The DMEK surgical procedure has quickly become a preferred type of transplant performed by corneal surgeons for qualified patients. With diabetes in nearly 40% of the donor population, determining which donors with diabetes are suitable and which are not is a very important question to address. Dr. Lass, the study chair, is from Eversight in Ohio. Dr. Lass is the recognized expert in Endothelium and among the top 1% of scholars with published works about Endothelium over the past ten years. It is an honor and an excellent opportunity for our eye bank to work with Dr. Lass.
